Title	Description
Disneyland 10th Anniversary Show	<p>DATE - January 3, 1965</p> <p>SUMMARY - To celebrate the "first fabulous decade" of the park, Walt previews what is to come, as "anything's possible at Disneyland." He is joined in this episode of <i>Walt Disney's Wonderful World of Color</i> by Julie Reihm, the first Disneyland Ambassador.</p> <p>We are led through the Imagineering department, where we see Mary Blair designing the facade for the It's a Small World attraction. Marc Davis is seen working on the Haunted Mansion. We also see a miniaturized layout of the Pirates of the Caribbean, including a "walking the plank" scene that was eventually cut.</p> <p>Tinker Bell then leads us to Sleeping Beauty Castle for the 10th anniversary celebration. A giant birthday cake and dancing candles sing the Sherman Brothers penned "Anniversary Song."</p> <p>Walt then recaps the brief but busy ten year history of the park. Along with shots of various foreign dignitaries, we get to see the infamous ribbon-cutting, or more appropriately, ribbon-tearing ceremony of the Monorail with Richard Nixon and family. And Walt seems especially proud of his fleet of submarines, the eighth largest in the world.</p> <p>The Mills family tour the Swiss Family Treehouse followed by a behind-the-scenes peek at the Enchanted Tiki Room courtesy of Jose the Audio-Animatronic parrot. The day is capped off with a nighttime performance of various Dixieland bands on the Rivers of America, including the Firehouse Five Plus Two making a return engagement to the park.</p> <p>What is a real treat here is Walt. All throughout this episode, he is particularly playful and charming, interacting with the Imagineers and fawning over Reihm like a proud uncle.</p> <p>EDITED FOR DVD - When the DVD version of the 10th Anniversary Show is compared to previous broadcast airings, it appears that the Enchanted Tiki Room sequence has been shortened. The original sequence ran a total of 10:46, but the DVD version clocks in at only 4:51, meaning that 5:55 has been removed.
