	SUMMARY - A spider wanders into a pyramid and discovers dancing mummies and animated hieroglyphics.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Considering their dance moves, those mummies appear to have seen 1929's <i>The Skeleton Dance</i> . Additionally, when the spider is surprised by mummies, he performs an Al Jolson-like routine shouting "Mummy!"

	SUMMARY - In an enchanted glade, the anthropomorphic title characters find love and battle a nasty old tree who threatens their happiness.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - The first color cartoon, <i>Flowers and Trees</i> was a huge success and won the very first Academy Award for animated short.

	SECTION - Accent on Music OR Leonard's Picks
The Cookie Carnival	LEONARD'S PICKS - Leonard Maltin discusses that black and white production had already started on this short when Walt learned of the Technicolor process for animation. All footage was scraped and redone in color at considerable expense.

	SUMMARY - A boy cookie helps a girl cookie enter a beauty contest to become Cookie Queen.
